Purpose/structure: To learn how to make a fully finished reed beginning from gouged pieces of cane. We will go through the process and practice each step of making a blank through the first half of the semester. The second half will focus on the finishing process. Individual reed help with current reeds in your box will be offered at each session. If more help is needed, extra time outside of class can be scheduled.

Reed Journal: You will be expected to keep a journal of your reeds. The template for the journal is provided in this syllabus. Each reed gets one entry. The completed journal pages of the finished reeds from the semester (12 in total) will be due by class time on the last week of classes as a hard-copy left in an envelope on my studio door.
